#### **Patient Rights and Responsibilities:**

• Lists of patient rights and responsibilities - <u>American Medical Association</u> It is both your right and your responsibility to understand. Whether a medical appointment or school meeting, do not leave the room if you don't know what your next steps are and who to contact with questions/concerns.

#### **Rights/responsibilities**

- The right to be believed
- Get information about your/your child's medical condition in words or a language you understand.
- See and understand your/your child's care and treatment plan.
- Be a part of the decisions made about your/your child's treatment.
- Be told what you need to know and what to do in follow up to the appointment or meeting.
- Have a reliable resource to get follow up information
- Coordinated care looking at the whole person, not just the individual parts
- Information you need to convey necessary medical information to less knowledgeable providers (e.g. ER letters)
- Easy access to medical records, test results, etc.
- Timely response to questions, sharing of test results
- It essentially boils down to the right to a medical home: <u>https://thepcc.org/content/defining-medical-home</u>
  - **Patient-centered:** A partnership among practitioners, patients, and their families ensures that decisions respect patients' wants, needs, and preferences, and that patients have the education and support they need to make decisions and participate in their own care.

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- **Comprehensive:** A team of care providers is wholly accountable for a patient's physical and mental health care needs, including prevention and wellness, acute care, and chronic care.
- **Coordinated:** Care is organized across all elements of the broader health care system, including specialty care, hospitals, home health care, community services and supports.
- Accessible: Patients are able to access services with shorter waiting times, "after hours" care, 24/7 electronic or telephone access, and strong communication through health IT innovations.
- **Committed to quality and safety:** Clinicians and staff enhance quality improvement to ensure that patients and families make informed decisions about their health.
